BLUEBERRY CANNONS ON THE RIDGE

You may have noticed more blueberry farms below the Ridge. As spring approaches, albeit late, farms will soon be producing blueberries. With that, comes the possibility of an increase in cannon noise.

A group called "Ban the Cannons" are opposed to the use of these bird scare devices. In contacting them and the Farm Industry Review Board, we've learned that a review is underway. The Fraser Valley Regional District and the Ministry of Agriculture have co-funded a study to determine the effectiveness of these devices. Results will be available soon and found on their website:

When identifiable items in the garbage are traced backed to the original owners, these people are horrified to learn that their garbage was not taken to the dump, but instead dumped on farmland.

HELP CLEAN UP THE RIDGE ON SUNDAY APRIL 19 10:00AM

TO: ALL DOGS ON THE RIDGE

Thank you for making our community a better place to live. We enjoy your company and most of your owners handle you very responsibly. Others have allowed some of you to cause considerable nuisance, trauma and potential injury to others.

Over the past few months, we've received several reports of your canine friends running at large, barking, chasing and biting. Some homeowners have put up with all-night barking. Another homeowner was attacked in her own backyard!

In the interest of mutual enjoyment in our community, please share this Bylaw* information with your owner: (*selected and paraphrased*)

- No person may keep more than two dogs per parcel of property (unless a kennel license has been issued)
- Every dog over the age of 6 months must wear a valid and current license.
- Running at large means any dog located in a public place that is not secured on a leash to a responsible and competent person.

(Exception: a dog in a designated "off leash" area)

• A potentially dangerous dog is any dog regardless of age, sex or breed which is running at large.

RESPONSIBLE DOG OWNERS:

- ALWAYS keep dogs secured at home, and on a leash when not at home.
- Immediately remove dog excrement and dispose of it in a sanitary manner.
- Monitor and control persistent barking.
- Obey the laws, and consider the comfort and well-being of other residents.

IF YOU HAVE A DOG PROBLEM:

- 1. Keep detailed notes of all incidents. (Take photos, where possible.)
- 2. Talk directly to the dog owner(s). Make them aware of your concerns.
- 3. Ask other neighbours to join you in a group approach to the dog owner(s).
- 4. If none of the above is feasible, or efforts have been unsuccessful, contact the SPCA @ 604-597-5655 (Mon. to Fri., 8:30 am 4:30 pm.)

In case of an **EMERGENCY** (e.g., a dangerous dog running at large): phone **both** the **POLICE** and the **SPCA**.



AIRPLANE NOISE

In May 2007, major airspace changes were implemented in north and south Surrey that caused commercial aircraft to fly over previously quiet but densely populated areas resulting in a substantial increase in noise.

In reaction to the quantum jump in aircraft noise, the south Surrey Citizens Against Aircraft Noise (SCAANS) was formed. Since then, SCAANS has been working with the City of Surrey, community groups, Federal and Provincial politicians, Nav Canada and YVR. They would tell you that Nav Canada and YVR have not been receptive to their proposals or even their requests for information. A key issue is that Nav Canada was formed under Federal legislation that does not require it to notify or consult communities that may be impacted by changes it makes to airplane routing.

The WPRRA has been supportive of the SCAANS effort, especially their desire to require Nav Canada to both consult and inform. At the upcoming AGM, a petition SCAANS is sending to Ottawa will be available for individuals to sign. This petition asks that the legislation governing Nav Canada be changed to require them to consult and inform. If you support this issue and this petition, we are providing you the opportunity to sign it at our AGM on April 29, 2009.

GARBAGE TRAINS BELOW PANORAMA RIDGE?

Metro Vancouver is seeking to amend its solid waste management plan to allow for the annual export of up to 600,000 tonnes of waste to the US. It proposes waste to be shipped via BNSF trains which will travel below the Ridge. One estimate indicated we could be looking at as many as eight additional trains per day. The WPRRA has made a submission to Metro Vancouver regarding the impact these trains will have on Panorama Ridge.
